CLASSROOM RULES AND EXPECTATIONS

- 5. Homework will be given 2-4 times a week. The homework must be completed on time. A student who is absent will have to makeup homework (one day to makeup for each day of absent, but no more than 3 days).

HOMEWORK, CLASSWORK, AND TEST/QUIZ POLICY

The purpose of homework is to provide students with practice and reinforcement of class material, as well as prepare for material to be presented the next day in class. **Please check your child's notebook frequently to be sure he/she is keeping up with the assignments**. Timed drills will be given at the beginning of each class and periodically collected and checked for a grade. Quizzes will be given <u>every</u> Friday, and comprehensive tests will be given at the end of each chapter/unit. Missed quizzes/tests must be made up after school. The student will be given one week to make up the quiz/test – if the quiz/test is not made up within this time frame, the student will be given a zero. *Note: Due to deadlines for grades, makeup times may be shortened at the end of a marking period.

MAKE-UP WORK / LATE WORK POLICY

Work must be turned in on time at the beginning of the period to receive full credit. Late work will not be accepted for credit.
